Fugitive methane from active and abandoned coal mines in Appalachia – where **75% of America's coal mine-related emissions** are concentrated – can be captured and repurposed for energy production, offering significant energy security, supply chain, and economic benefits for the region.

CMM capture projects in Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia could repurpose for beneficial use **25.9 million metric tons of CO2e emissions annually**.
